Lions planning East Side beach project

The Oconto Falls Lions have had ongoing conversations with representatives from ST Paper about their mutual interest in projects to improve the quality of life in the Oconto Falls area.

The Lions have a long tradition of community improvement projects. ST Paper appreciates the success it has experienced in the community and has supported many community organizations

and projects through donations.

In an effort to build a partnership with the Lions, Sahil Tak, vice president of operations at ST Paper, recently spearheaded an effort to donate \$5,000 to the Lions for their community efforts.

Of that contribution, \$500 went to the Oconto Falls Lioness Club for the Avenue of Lights. With the remaining contribution, plans are being solidified

by the Lions for a signature community project along the Oconto River near the East Side beach to provide better access to the river and promote community use of that resource. This may involve a boardwalk-type structure that would provide handicapped access for fishing and would promote greater recreational use of the waterfront.
